The weather continues in a very unsettled condition. Cold easterly winds still prevail over the north sea, & the British Isles, & northern France. The sky is generally overcast, and rain or hail has fallen in many places: - ^{from} Plymouth a slight fall of snow is reported.

Temperatures are lower than they were yesterday and, except on the coast of Norway, barometers have continued to fall.

An area of comparatively low pressure ^{still} appears to exist in the neighbourhood of the Bay of Biscay.
